

## QUILT CATEGORIES 2024

100A- Large Pieced- Length plus width must be greater than 120 inches; made entirely by one person, including quilting.

100B- Large Pieced Duo- Length plus width must be greater than 120 inches. Joint effort by more than one person, including quilting.

200A- Wall Quilt Pieced – Length plus width is equal to, or less than, 120 inches. Made entirely by one person, including quilting.

200B- Wall Quilt Pieced Duo- Length plus width is equal to, or less than, 120 inches. Joint effort by more than one person, including quilting.

300A- Applique- A significant amount of the quilt contains either hand or machine applique. Made entirely by one person, including quilting.

300B- Applique Duo- A significant amount of the quilt contains either hand or machine applique. A joint effort by more than one person, including quilting.

400- Machine Embroidery- Quilt must be approximately 75% machine embroidered. Entry form must indicate if it is a joint effort, quilted by someone other than entrant.

500- Hand Work- More than 50% of the quilt must be completed by hand, including hand embroidery, red work and wool (not hand applique or hand quilting). Entry must indicate if it has been quilted by someone else.

600- Miniature- Length plus width no larger than 48"; block size no larger than 4". Miniatures require all elements in scale, including scale of fabric, shorter quilting stitch and binding less than ¼". It must replicate a full-size quilt pattern. Made by one person, including quilting.

700- Art Quilt- Must be "Original" design, including inspirational photo. Made by one person including quilting. No kits, patterns or Block of the Month allowed.

800- Other Technique- Any technique not fitting into another category, such as Whole-cloth and embellishment. Entry form must indicate if it was quilted by someone else.

900- Modern- Quilts that are functional, minimalist and inspired by modern design. Bold color and modern prints may be used as well as areas of neutral color to provide negative space. Modern quilts often use asymmetry in design, improvisational piecing, the reinterpretation of traditional blocks or the lack of visible block structure. They are generally quilted simply with lines of stitching or grid patterns. Entry form must indicate if quilted by someone else.

1000- Wearable Art- Clothing, Bags, or accessories; any technique but batting and quilting are required. Must be made by one person, including quilting.

1100- Home Dec- Any item used in the home, such as table runner, pillows, placemats, pot holders, etc. Made entirely by one person including the quilting. No wall hangings will be accepted in this category.
